# 3 EVENT ENTRIES

## 3.1 EVENT CATEGORIES

The below categories will be run for the 2022 Oceania BMX Freestyle Championships:

Category	Class	Eligibility (based on year of birth)	Entry Limit
Championship (Elite)	Male/Female	15+	30 Riders (15 x Male and 15 x Female)*

\* a waitlist will be set up and upon entry close, limits will be reviewed based on entries/waitlists received.  
*For example: if there are more male riders than the limit listed, and less female riders than the limit listed, the number will be increased for male and decreased for female, up to the total number of riders specified.*

The below categories will be run for the 2022 Oceania BMX Freestyle Championships Challenge:

Category	Class	Eligibility (based on year of birth)	Entry Limit
Challenge (Participation U7)	No Gender Division	6 and under	12 Riders*
Challenge (Junior U11)	Male/Female	7-10	16 Riders (8 x Male and 8 x Female)*
Challenge (Junior U13)	Male/Female	11-12	16 Riders (8 x Male and 8 x Female)*
Challenge (Junior U15)	Male/Female	13-14	16 Riders (8 x Male and 8 x Female)*
Challenge (Amateur)	Male/Female	15+	24 Riders (12 x Male and 12 x Female)*
Challenge (Masters)	Male/Female	30+	12 Riders (6 x Male and 6 x Female)*

\* a waitlist will be set up and upon entry close, limits will be reviewed based on entries/waitlists received.  
*For example: if there are more male riders than the limit listed, and less female riders than the limit listed, the number will be increased for male and decreased for female, up to the total number of riders specified. Alternatively, if one category is undersubscribed and another over, entry limits may be increased/decreased per category as required.*

For a category to be held, at least five (5) riders must be registered in that category.

**Please Note:** We recommend entering the event early to ensure your spot. Should the entry limits be met for any category, riders will need to enter onto the waitlist. Once entries close, numbers will be reviewed and category limits will be adjusted based on entries received to accommodate as many riders on the waitlist as possible.

### 3.2 ENTRY PROCESS & COST

Entry will be online via EntryBoss only. It is the rider/rider's guardian's responsibility to ensure that their entry is correct.

Riders who have entered and are no longer able to attend, can use the EntryBoss scratching mechanism prior to the Scratching Cut Off listed above. After this date has passed, in order to obtain a refund, riders must submit a medical certificate to [events@auscycling.org.au](mailto:events@auscycling.org.au), in line with the [AusCycling Refund Policy](#).

### 3.3 MEMBERSHIP

All National Federations affiliated to the Oceania Cycling Confederation may take part in Continental Championships events.

The Championship Event will be open to:

- All riders holding a UCI Licence from a National Federation who is a member of the Oceania Cycling Confederation; or
- An Australian with an AusCycling Race Membership (All Disciplines or Off Road only); or
- A Member of Cycling New Zealand.

All Riders in the Championship Event must have a UCI ID.

The Challenge Event will be open to:

- All riders holding a UCI Licence from a National Federation who is a member of the Oceania Cycling Confederation; or

- An Australian with an AusCycling Race Membership (All Disciplines or Off Road only); or
- An Australian with an AusCycling Day Membership; or
- A Member of Cycling New Zealand.

### **3.4 EVENT REGISTRATION**

All riders are required to attend the Event Registration to collect a wristband. This wristband will be your pass for the duration of the event – please do not take it off or lose it.

## **4 RACE INFORMATION**

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### **4.1 RULES AND REGULATIONS**

The Championship Event will be conducted under the BMX Freestyle Regulations of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI).

The Challenge Event will be conducted under the BMX Freestyle Regulations of AusCycling (AC).

### **4.2 EVENT FORMAT**

- Each Category of the event will have a set number of Rounds of Competition.
- Each Round of Competition will follow the same format:
  - Riders given 2 x 1min Runs on the course.
- A run is determined by the judges confirming the rider is ready to start, the clock starts when they drop in.
- A buzzer will sound at the end of 1min. Any tricks not completed within this time will NOT count to the score.
- The Judges will score each run individually according to the Judging Criteria outlined in Section 4.3.1 of the Technical Guide.

#### **4.2.1 PARTICIPATION**

- Made up of one Round of Competition.
- Riders will be broken up into Heats at random to perform their two runs.
- No scores will be kept.

#### **4.2.2 JUNIORS / MASTERS**

- Made up of one Round of Competition.
- The results of this Round will be the final placings.
- Riders will be broken up into Heats at random to perform their two runs. The best run only will count for their overall result.

#### **4.2.3 AMATEUR**

- Made up 2 x Rounds of Competition (Qualifying & Finals).
- Qualifying:

- Riders will be broken up into Heats at random to perform their runs. Your score is compared to all riders – not just those in your heat.
- Both runs will count for your score.
- The number of riders who progress to Finals will depend on the total entries (4-12).
- Finals:
  - The riders will run in ascending order from their Qualifying Position (lowest placed qualifier for finals goes first).
  - Only your best run will count for your final score / placing.
- The results from the Finals round will be the final results.

#### 4.2.4 ELITE

The Elite Competition will be run according to UCI regulations for Freestyle Park Events.

Number of entries	Competition phase	Qualification rule	Number of heats
5-8 entries	2 phases: Qualification x 1 Final x 1	Top 4 in qualification advance to Final	Qualification: as below 1 heat of 4 in Final
9 -15 entries	2 phases: Qualification x 1 Final x 1	Top 8 in qualification advance to Final	Qualification: as below 2 heats of 4 in Final
16-31 entries	2 phases: Qualification x 1 Final x 1	Top 12 in qualification advance to Final	Qualification: as below 2 heats of 6 in Final
More than 31 entries	3 phases: Qualification x 1 Semifinal x 1 Final x 1	Top 24 in qualification advance to Semi-Final Top 12 in semi-final advance to Final	Qualification: as below 4 heats of 6 in Semi-Final 2 heats of 6 in Final

**Number of heats:** The number of heats in each round is found in the table above. For the Qualification phase, the number of heats should be chosen such that as many heats as possible have 4-6 riders.

- Whenever it is not possible for all heats to have 6 riders, a number of heats will have either 4, 5 or 6 riders. By preference, heats should be formed with the highest number of riders possible. Any heats that do not have 6 riders, will be at the start of the heat order
- With a field limit of 30 Riders, there will be 2 x Rounds of Competition – with the top 12 progressing to Finals.
- During Qualifying, riders will be broken into heats of 4 (if 30 x riders enter exactly, the first two heats will have an extra rider) – and running order will be in reverse order from UCI World Cup Points Ranking. Riders who have no rankings, will be run at random.
- During Qualifying, Riders will get 2 x 1min Runs – with BOTH scores being averaged for their qualifying score and rank.
- During Finals, Riders will get a further 2 x 1min Runs – with the highest score counting as their final score and rank.

### 4.3 JUDGING

#### 4.3.1 APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES

A panel consisting of three (3) judges (including a head judge) shall be appointed. They shall independently evaluate the performance of each rider based upon the judging criteria.

### 4.3.2 JUDGING CRITERIA

The performance of each rider is judged on overall impression including, but not limited to:

- Difficulty (refers to not only the tricks performed but also the placement of the tricks within the course and the combinations used)
- Height (amplitude of the tricks performed)
- Flow
- Originality (tricks and lines) and versatility
- Style
- Progression
- Variety of tricks (refers to a good mix of standard airs, rotations, grinds, ...)
- Risk factor
- Landings
- Use of the course
- Execution

The overall composition of the runs is most important as the judges evaluate the sequences of tricks, the amount of risk in the routine, and how the rider uses the course. The judges take errors such as falls and stops into consideration as described in section 6bis.6.028 of the [UCI Regulations – BMX Freestyle](#).

## 5 AWARDS & PRIZING
