UCI Regulations

The Oceania Mountain Bike Continental Series is run under UCI Regulations.

Eligibility

Entries are open to any UCI license holder, except Masters

- Riders belonging to a UCI MTB TEAM or a UCI MTB WORLD SERIES TEAM
- There is no quota limitation for the National Federations
- Any rider can participate, no matter the country or the continent

Participants must have the following licenses to compete:

- Oceania Member: License from their National Federation and UCI ID.
- Non Oceania Member: UCI License and UCI ID.

Registration

Entries are made directly with the race organiser of each round.

Series Categories

Cross-country: Elite, Under 23 and Under 19

Downhill: Elite, Under 19 and Under 17 (Non UCI category)

Riding up is not permitted.

Prize Money

For 2026 the UCI has approved a derogation that existing prize money for events are applied. For clarity the prize money for listed in the [UCI Financial Regulations](#) does not apply for the 2026 Oceania Continental Series.

Continental Series Standings

For Elite, U23 and U19 categories points are awarded as per annexes 2 and 3 of the [UCI Mountain Bike Regulations](#).

Series standings are based on the top four results of each rider.

Series rankings will be calculated based on the below points scale.

For Under 17 (Cadet) downhill category points are awarded as per the below scale for second year under 17 riders only.

As a matter of clarification, these points are applicable for the Continental Series standings only. Riders competing in the under 17 category do not earn UCI points.

Continental Series qualification pathway to the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup

Riders can qualify for the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup in Cross-country and Downhill as follows:

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The qualification criteria listed above are not applicable for riders who are a member of a UCI MTB World Series Team.

As a matter of clarification, riders who are a member of a UCI MTB World Series Team can participate in the race, but they cannot earn to a qualification quota or Golden Ticket for the UCI Mountain Bike World Cup through the Continental Series.
